I loved the opportunity to discuss this with not only the MP for our electorate Barbara Edmonds but also Jan Tinetti and Aupito William Sio. I know that we need to address the issues schools are facing as only then can systems change.

School lunches start on Monday and please a reminder to work with us, all teachers will be promoting the lunches and we will sit for an extra 5 minutes to talk and encourage our KURA kids to try new food.

It is vital that we give the food the 4 week menu trial and remember each day our KURA kids will vote on the food by placing their container in either the happy face, sad face or the neutral face box. We will collate the data each day from each class and we will also weigh each day the scraps from each class so we can then say at the end of the 4 week cycle which menu's work for our school.

The food will have less sugar and more of what a child this age needs and there will also be plenty of fruit available from our fruit in school's delivery.

I will give you updates each newsletter so you know what our thinking is.

We had our first fire drill this week at school. Over the next two weeks we will have an earthquake and lockdown drill to ensure we are all ready for anything that comes our way.

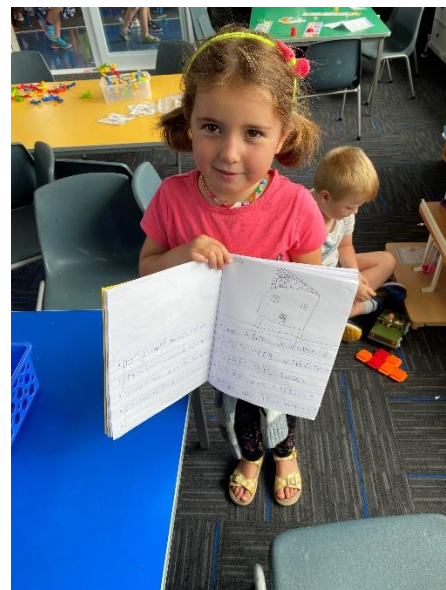
READING WITH OUR JUNIOR KURA KIDS
